QUESTIONS	TIPS - HOW TO RESPOND TO QUESTIONS
1. Reasons for applying to participate in program.	 Demonstrate your commitment to STEM education (provide evidence or examples). Outline your commitment to improving your own STEM skills to support the strategic objectives of your school.
2. How does the teacher attending camp benefit the teacher, students and school community? Outline of how teacher will build participation in STEM on return to own school.	 Outline your plans for outreach within and beyond your school following camp. Demonstrate how these activities will align to: school improvement target areas; your professional development; your school's staff professional development; and/or community outreach. How will your plan support long-term STEM improvement and engagement within your school and/or community?
3. Experience chaperoning school or other groups.	 Provide evidence of your chaperoning experience (include examples of support and problem-solving skills required to manage situations). State the number of camps, programs or excursions you have participated in and describe your role.
4. What are chaperones' key responsibilities?	 Identify your understanding of the key responsibilities of a chaperone on a camp such as the this. Consider the following: travelling with students; supervising students at the camp accommodation; supervising students in the community; supporting the health and wellbeing of students; and working with other chaperones. Provide examples of how you have demonstrated these key responsibilities.
5. Principal's endorsement	 Principal will comment on teacher's: Integrity and reliability as a chaperone. Commitment to the year-long program and future outreach within and beyond school; and Professional learning and leadership within school.
